FASTBALL LEGENDS WERE IMPACT TROIKA

Three of our 2012 Legends shared not seasons, but decades as team-mates in the glory days of fastball in Ontario. **Harry Bartley, Jim Brown and Rick McCaw** doffed uniforms for many St. Thomas-London area teams including St. Thomas Western Memorials, Empires, Pest Control and Durston Pools as well as the famed London Dukes and Cable TV and competed in the Memorial, Ontario-Michigan and Hamilton Big Four leagues, OASA and Canadian championships.

The trio shared several Memorial League championships, were part of the 1967 host Champions St. Thomas for the Ontario Eliminations, and two of them travelled to Winnipeg for the 1970 Canadians with London Cable TV.

All were noted for excellence in their defensive positions, and were “tough outs” in the heart of the batting order.

Awesome in their own right, and mildly comparable to MLB Yankees’ “Murderers Row”, all three held great respect for pitchers Detroit’s Bonnie Jones, Reno Patenuzzi and southpaws Pete Landers and Brad Underwood as tough combatants.

HARRY BARTLEY

Venerable veteran

Born – Feb. 15, 1945

Hometown – Belmont, ON

Harry’s career started in baseball in hometown Belmont and St. Thomas and switched to fastball at age 17 when he joined Glanworth in the London Major League.

An accomplished hockey player, Harry played with the London Jr. B Nationals and later with area senior hockey teams.

In mid 1960s, he joined St. Thomas Royal House senior team, and was a member of the St. Thomas host Ontario Championship team in 1964, again in 1967 as well as in 1996, earning a few MVPs along the way. Incredibly, he played in the Canadians in Saskatoon in both 1967 and 1997, bridging a thirty year span.

Harry “Hat” Bartley was the 3B cornerstone where his wide stance challenged hitters to put one by him – they rarely did.

A similar posture in the batters box seldom let good pitches pass – Harry could hit for power and average to every field and was a game-breaker with timely clutch hits.

Defensively he was a master of deception, often goading runners into trying to stretch doubles into triples. His decoy stance at 3B would culminate with a snap tag that would snuff out rally opportunities.

Harry and wife Dianne have one son Sean, and two daughters – Debra & husband Jeff with three grandchildren Derek, Catherine & Sarah, and Colleen & husband Andy with two grandchildren Lauren & Nathan.

Harry worked for 40 years with 3M in London and as well, operated the family farm in Belmont. Life now is more simple – farming and golfing.

JIM BROWN

Fearsome foe

Born - Nov. 22, 1938

Hometown – St. Thomas, ON

Jim played baseball with his hometown St. Thomas Elgins, mentored by player/manager Tommy White and as a junior “call-up” was part of the Inter-county Sr. Championship team in 1958. At age 23, he changed to fastball with the Western Hotel squad in the St. Thomas and District League.

The popular figure of “Casey at the Bat”, who struck fear into opposing hurlers about to deliver a pitch to the plate, is an apt image of Jim Brown in the 1960s in the Memorial Fastball League.

Jim’s broad shoulders and sinewy arms were indeed intimidating, and the total package was punctuated by his menacing black moustache and dark, penetrating stare as he focused on the delivery from the mound.

The pinnacle of success came with the famed London Cable TV squad in 1970. His defensive abilities behind “the dish” were second to none, and during his career, he was battery-mate to acknowledged legends Dick Hames, Metro Szeryk and Steve Virag. “Brown” was the catalyst and solid foundation upon which batting orders were built. In 1970, he was named All-Canadian at the nationals in Winnipeg as London went undefeated and captured the gold medal. In 1977, Jim slugged his way to the 1977 Memorial League “triple crown” batting title.

Jim has two daughters Catherine and Cheryl and four grandchildren – Jackilyn, Jennifer, Nicholas and James.

Like any Canadian athlete, he also enjoyed hockey and continues to enjoy golf, fishing and visits to the YMCA.

RICK McCAW

Superb centre-fielder

January 10, 1942 - June 16, 2012

Hometown – St. Thomas, ON

Sadly, Rick McCaw passed away last weekend after battling cancer. His career started in Union ON, playing in a men’s league before he was a teenager and later baseball for the St. Thomas Tom Cats. He then concentrated on fastball in Glanworth before joining St. Thomas Western Memorials in 1963.

Rick’s championship teams included OASA titles in 1964 & ‘67 and the Canadians in 1970 where he was named an All-Star.

In CF, Rick was fleet-of-foot, aggressively charging balls hit in his direction, coming up throwing, and earning respect as one of the best. For imagery, think of the talents of Brian Paton and Ryan Wolfe – now you get the picture.

Rick won the home run derby one year in the Memorial League and had a memorable 1964 game in OASA playdowns hitting three homers against the Oshawa Tonys. More than simply a player, Rick worked tirelessly as a manager, recruiting players to help keep the St. Thomas juggernaut intact for many memorable seasons.

Rick had received special OASA recognition for his stellar play as well as his contributions to coaching. Typically Canadian, Rick played hockey in the winter, and enjoyed golfing, fishing and camping. Rick is survived by his wife Sue; two daughters, Laurie & husband John, Stacy & grand-daughter Lilly; and son Steve & wife Kim & granddaughter Mariah.

Rick worked for GM Diesel in London, lived in St. Thomas and has the memorable distinction of having played fastball with his dad Bill, as well as suiting up with his son Steve in senior ranks.

Legends welcomes courageous

Cody Hughes

Newmarket's courageous Cody Hughes, along with parents Melodie & Peter and girlfriend Cassondra, are guests of Legends. At age two, Cody had numbness in his feet, and by age seven the sensation had spread to pain in many of his joints and he experienced seizures. Diagnosed with arthritis at age 10, Cody loved sports and played hockey and excelled at ball with the Newmarket Hawks AAA team.



The ailment turned out to be rheumatoid arthritis and was worsening, causing severe headaches, memory losses and such severe pain that Cody's body would literally shut down. At 16, Cody was experiencing respiratory and heart problems. His medication included as many as 48 pills a day, and the inflammatory disease was attacking many joints, including his jaw and chin that were decimated. After a four-year wait, including two years in bed and spending 2008-2011 with a complete absence of any quality of life, Cody finally received a delicate 12 hour surgery on January 11, 2011 resulting in his receiving a titanium jaw and artificial chin.

Good news – Cody is on the road to recovery, and despite missing a couple of years, he is back in high school.

KEITH WAGLER Menacing moundsman

Born – Oct. 18, 1947

Hometown – Tavistock, ON

Keith Wagler, born on the family farm in East Zorra Township near Tavistock started playing competitively with Tavistock Midgets (1965), and led his Juveniles to the 1966 OASA championship. To develop strength and endurance, coach Fred Currah insisted that Keith warm up a full hour before each game.

In 1970, Keith joined the Kitchener Forwell Super V's (later Evergreens/Edelweiss Tavern) senior team. In an era when Ontario, Inter-City and Memorial Leagues were at their peak, Keith's devastating rise-ball stymied the greatest hitters.

In 1972, Keith played 104 games, with a win-loss record of 79-13, leading Tavistock Merchants to the South Perth crown and Kitchener to the Inter-City title, copping the league's pitching award with a 1.07 ERA.

1975 was memorable as Kitchener Evergreens beat Hamilton Waxmen in the OASA Eliminations and finished 3rd at the Canadians.

In his last full season (1978), Keith sported an ERA of 0.75 and was top pitcher in the Memorial League. Spanning 17 seasons, Keith also played for Stratford, Woodstock and Norwich, and was forced to retire (arthritis) in 1979 having recorded 21 no-hitters, of which five were perfect games.

Keith favorably recalls his years in Kitchener, with intense encounters with legends Wally Dick, Bob Domik, Dick Hames and Pete Landers, that resulted in life-long friendships.

Keith continues his 42 year career at B-W Feed & Seed in New Hamburg – with retirement perhaps in the next year. His #1 fan has always been wife Ruth, with whom he lives on a 28 acre property near New Hamburg. They have four married children, who have blessed them with 11 grandchildren aged 18 years and younger, some of whom are pitchers, but not necessarily on Keith's suggestion.

The "pride of Punkeydoodles Corners" – Keith Wagler - was simply, one of the best ever to toe the rubber.

RON HERGOTT Sport versatility

Born – Dec. 31, 1942

Hometown – Kitchener, ON

Ron originally played baseball for Kitchener Panthers in mid '1960s, switching to fastball with Waterloo Bridge Sports (Inter-County League) and CHYMrs (Inter-City League), and later Kitchener Evergreens (OFL 1977-79).

As a young athlete, he focused on hockey, playing with OHA Niagara Falls Flyers and later professionally during 1964-70 with Portland Buckaroos, Long Island Ducks, New Haven Blades and Muskegon Mohawks, sandwiching two Canadian senior Allen Cup championships with Galt Hornets in 1969 and 1971. His skill was revered – winning the scoring championship one year at right wing – and duplicating the feat as a defenceman – the only player in senior hockey to achieve that distinction.

In fastball, Ron was a feared hitter, homering often in the wooden bat era. A memorable dinger occurred in Port Colborne in the top of the 16th inning with "Hergy" launching a "moon shot" over the outfield fence... and over a house... to win the game 1-0! An 80 year old veteran fan congratulated Ron, stating that in 65 years of watching fastball, he had never seen anyone hit a ball that far.

Ron's versatility went beyond serving as a first baseman, feeling comfortable at all defensive positions, including a season at shortstop as well as assuming catching chores and patrolling the outfield.

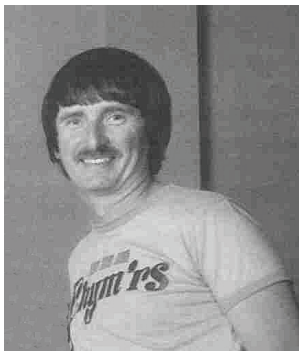
Always a colorful performer for the fans, Ron provided locker room leadership and preached that the key to success is teamwork - that individual achievements are by-products of the larger success.

Ron was a 28-year career firefighter with City of Cambridge and lives in Elmira with best friend Sandra, has a son Deen 49, daughter Dana 44 and two lovely grandchildren Scout 3 and Brant 1. As a retiree, Ron enjoys playing golf, TV sports, and an annual winter hiatus to Myrtle Beach.

JOHN MacTAVISH - April 20, 1947-April 26, 2012



Softball aficionado John MacTavish is gone - a victim of cancer the result of which has the 2012 season with one fewer fan. Fan, as in fantastic, an enthusiastic and calm individual who collected a half century of memories from the diamonds.

From fastball player and coach, to slo-pitch enthusiast and eventually to event volunteer, it will be one fewer lawn chair behind home plate at many a game.

John accumulated a wide range of experiences from a youthful player in the Bluevale / Wingham / Whitechurch area, as a long-time participant in the Kitchener Fastball League, notably with Big Bill's, coaching the mid '80s Waterloo CHYMrs, and as an ardent fan that spanned decades from the 1960s, will be a friendly face noticeably absent at wide-spread ball parks.

With a quiet demeanor masking a wealth of knowledge, John was equally comfortable watching on-field action with a handful of fans at local games as observing the world stage with thousands, having attended ISF championships in Saskatoon, SK (1976), Midland MI (1996), Christchurch NZ (2004) and Saskatoon again in 2009. He was sufficiently astute to enjoy the "game within the game" and was often a decision or two ahead of many field managers.

John is gone.. he is missed.. and somewhere this weekend, he's waiting for a higher league's "opening pitch".

Fittingly, John will be remembered through the "John MacTavish Field of Dreams", a new facility at Camp McGovern that has its roots with Big Brothers/Big Sisters, an organization that provided for Cathy and John's "special family".

1) **New Zealand Black Sox (3-2)** – Sitting as World #2 behind Australia is not comfortable for the Black Sox and while this is a bit of test squad for 2013 ISF, the lineup is deep and formidable. Most of the roster has enjoyed North American competition with club teams, and the Achilles heel may be on the mound. With the absence of p **Jeremy Manley**, veteran **Heine Shannon**, **Penese Iosefo** and **Tane Richardson** (a former Waterloo Hallman Twin), will be given lots of work, with late addition youngsters **Nick Hayes** and **Kurt Schulum** gaining national team experience. Establishing an overall confident winning attitude is a collective goal, with each plate appearance to be charted to assist in determining the final 2013 Kiwi lineup. Black Sox in the final to defend their Legends title.

2) **Hill United Chiefs (3-1)** – **Adam Folkard**, currently arguably the best pitcher on the planet will have to throw tons of innings as backup **Mike Joseph** continues to improve his mound performances. The line-up boasts veteran Canadians **Ryan Thompson** and **Jeff Ellsworth**, Aussie infielder **Nick Shailes** as well as youth with former Twins **Brad Ezekiel** and **Steve Mulalley**. Team should be speedy on the base paths and defence will shine with Folkard in the circle. In the beginning was Adam, and they'll need him throughout the middle... and in the end.

3) **Midland Explorers (11-1)** – The addition of **Don Scott**, former Hallman Twins fire-baller, provides much needed pitching to complement **Grant Patterson**, a long-time mainstay for the Explorers. Noteworthy is the return of savvy catcher/outfielder **Adam Lalonde**. Midland hosts the 2012 ISC World Tourney in August and has tinkered mildly with its traditional roster. Look for St. Mary's slugger **Dale "Red" Levy** to lead the offence, as the team prepares to improve on its disappointing 14th place finish last year in Quad Cities. Reaching the semi-final game this weekend is an admirable goal.

4) **Kitchener Cubs (15-1)** - Pitching squad has not changed since last year, making it a challenge for Cubs to make the playoff round. Key match-up with Midland to potentially grab the 3rd spot. The team's roster has been solid for a few seasons, which provides management "on paper" knowledge to understand precisely the 2012 potential. Full credit to a competitive team with a roster of Waterloo Region and local area talent. Tough and busy early schedule means team could be done for the weekend by Saturday noon.

5) **Toronto Gators (20-1)** – Gators have added durable, difficult to predict, and versatile pitcher / DH **Greg Garrity** to join other pitchers included heralded maritimer **Donnelly Archibald** and K-W born youngster **Andrew Putnam**. Just in their 3rd season as the re-invented Gators, this season should be an improvement on the 2011 4th place finish in the ISC - Deuce championship. Objective this weekend – test the bats and the pitching against solid senior teams. Last game will be the Sunday early bird at 8 am against the Chiefs.
