

## JUBILIANT TWINS CHAMPS IN 2008

In Kimberly WI in 2008, the **Kitchener Rivershark Twins** trailed **Saskatoon Aspen Interiors** 3-0 with one out in the 6th inning and having only tallied one hit to that point. Back-to-back HRs by **Pat Shannon** and **Blair Ezekiel** narrowed the margin to 3 -2 after six complete. With one out in the 7th, **Ryan Wolfe** homered to tie the game and **Jody Eidt** followed moments later for a two-run shot of his own. Twins won 6-3 and became first Canadian team in 13 years to claim the ISC title (the 1993 Toronto Gators were first-ever Canadian team to win the ISC crown, repeating the feat in 1995).





# FARM CLAIMS 2007 TITLE



In 2007, Kitchener hosted it's third ISC Word Tournament and the perennially strong Farm Tavern of Madison WI rode the arm of Outstanding Pitcher Korrey Gareau (5-0, 41 k, 1.08 ERA) to capture its third ISC Championship (champs previously in 1997 & 1999). The Farm was undefeated (6-0) and beat Casa Trejo So Cal Bombers of Palm Springs CA back-to-back in the tourneys final two days. The Farm's Manager and Sponsor Rod Peterson accepts the ISC Carroll Forbes trophy from ISC president-elect Dean Oscar, while Farm coach Dave Leblanc displays a champion's smile.

## TEAMS SOUGHT FOR LEGENDS & UNDER 21 EVENTS

Concurrent popular events at the ISC World Tournament include the ISC Legends and ISC Under 21 competitions, scheduled for Thursday August 14 - Saturday August 16.

Teams are currently being sought for participation.

**Legends** - eligible players must reach age 50 during 2014 calendar year and if a player on a ISC Legends team is also on a ISC World Tournament team roster, that player cannot play on a ISC Legends team until his ISC World Tournament team is eliminated. Note - OOR rules do not apply to the Legends.

**U21** - All teams, regardless of location or region are eligible and eligible players are those who have not reached the age of 22.
