# Welcome Back to Kitchener!

**It's great to have** international "fastball fever" in Kitchener on the eve of the 2014 International Softball Congress world championship. A full slate of 48 "open" teams will vie for the coveted title, with complementing events featuring ten Legends "Over 50" teams and four "Under 21" squads.

Five diamonds at two facilities (Peter Hallman Ball Yard and Budd Park) will be the venue for 174 games spanning the eight day event.

Opening games for the tournament are scheduled for Saturday August 8 at 2 pm at Peter Hallman Ball Yard and 4 pm at Budd Park.

Thirty-two teams participate in the opening round of 16 games on Saturday, with winners advancing to the second round to meet the top-ranked 16 teams who have received a first round bye. (Continued on Page #4






# **Kitchener Diamond Jaxx Earned Second Host Team Spot**

The Kitchener Diamond Jaxx, Flamborough area, and without a home league in which to perform, well-established ioined the Kitchener Fastball League. In its 7<sup>th</sup> season the Jaxx took the 2013 KFL

ISC pitching greats **Dean Holoien**, **Todd Martin** and venerable **Darren Zack**, along with all-world position players **Todd Budke** and **Sean O'Brien** will take to the stage to be interviewed, questioned and provided a "open mike" to share memories of "the good, the bad and of course the ugly" that coincides with championships, errors and heart-break in the highly competitive nature of elite fastball.

**Holoien**, still participating as an impact player, was the 2009 ISC Most Valuable Player as a member of the Kitchener ON Rivershark Twins, has been an All-World player on 6 occasions spanning 2001 – 2011.

Martin is a three-time Outstanding Pitcher in the ISC – 1996 and 1998 with the Tampa FL Smokers and 2008 with the Kitchener ON Rivershark Twins, and has been an All-World player nine times between 1994-2008.

Zack, unparalleled in his ISC mound performances, and a 2010 inductee into the ISC Hall of Fame, holds four Outstanding Pitcher awards (1993-2000), and nine All-World designations (1992-2004), most notably with the Toronto Gators.

**Budke**, the 2009 leading batter, is a six-time All-World and was inducted into the ISC Hall of Fame in 2012.

**O'Brien**, a veteran catcher earned five All-World designations from 2002-10. M.C. will be **Jody Eidt**, who earned worthy credentials of his own as a 3-time MVP, and 6 time All-World.
