

Mark Turner continues his offensive hot streak with two HR's vs. Indian Brook

Turner belts two homeruns as the Murphy's Fish and Chips extend winning streak to 3 games, Charros win to keep perfect record intact

Pitchers beware; Mark Turner is seeing incoming pitches like they are beach balls, so well in fact he leads the Shooters Fastpitch League with 3 homeruns all of which have come in the last two games.
