Only one of the runs were earned as Wildcat 2B Noah Baker was charged with an error. The inning ended with Desilet getting thrown out at home. Wellesley responded with a pair of their won from Lebold single followed by Brendan Dietrich's. Dietrich scored on a pass ball charged to Richard who was the Quebec catcher. Runs in the 4th and 6th put Wellesley ahead but Quebec replied with a pair in the bottom of the 6th to take the lead back again doing the damage with 2 outs. A **Tristen Lapierre** single and a Godbout triple combined with another pass ball and a wild pitch did the damage and set up the 7th inning. Wildcat CF Brendan Dietrich made sure the game was to continue, as he led off with a homerun. However, a Spencer Bricknell single was left stranded, keeping the score tied. It only took 2 batters for Quebec to get the lead back permanently, as Justin Roy led off with a triple and was scored on a Richard sacrifice fly for the game winning run. The teams combined for 27 hits off the starters, who both finished the game.

A quick look at the line score will tell you a lot about this game. 25 runs on 27 hits, and three 7- run half innings. Newfoundland jumped out to 9-0 only to see the Wildcats bounce back with 14 runs in their next 2 at bats. The Wildcats scored runs in only 2 innings but 7 in each of the 4th and 5th. The comeback began with 5 consecutive singles in B4. The onslaught ended with a 2 run Chayse Herrfort homerun. The team from the rock didn't die as they responded with 2 runs, mostly thanks to a Jordan Pomeroy triple. A pair of 2 run homeruns in B5 contributed much of the 7 runs scored in that inning. Troy Moffit and Brendan Schneider hit the dingers and give Wellesley a 14-9 lead. Newfoundland saw only one more runner reach base and Wellesley completed the most impressive come from behind win, of the championship. They finished the day scoring 22 runs in their 2 games while giving up 20. Newfoundland scored 21 runs today while giving up 15.

Chepstow jumped to an early 1-0 lead as Dallas Kipfer singled home Logan Tolton in B1. They scored another 3 in B3 from back to back jacks, Logan Bell hit a drive over the centerfield fence also scoring Tolton while Dallas Kipfer drove one past the leftfielder and kept running for an inside the park homer and a 4-0 lead. The Selects scored their first run of the game when Jordan Valcamp's single scored Easton Neufeld who had earlier hit a double. In the inning Pavey took a bullet line drive off his shin but remained in the game. In T6 Hudson helped himself out by singling in Anthony Rebeyka, who was running for Clayton Mckenzie after his single. He quickly scored on a triple from Reid Dubkowski to pull them within one and getting Pavey out of the game. Dubkowski scored on a Mac Fischer wild pitch to tie the game.
