First place and undefeated Moose Jaw Canadians opened the morning with a match against the Saskatoon Padres and were followed by second place AGI Masters playing Grande Prairie Pirates. The winners were to advance to the Gold medal final Sunday at noon and loser will fight it out for third place.

The match up in the circle saw Moose Jaw go with Russ Kennon and Saskatoon with **Darrell Iron.** This was a bit of a surprise as the Canadians choose to rest the Preliminary Round Top Pitcher Xavier Tremblay. The decision did not hurt until T5 as Moose Jaw entered the inning ahead 4-2. The Padres then exploded for 8 runs to kick off the inning. Kennon gave up a pair and left the game for Tremblay with the bases loaded. The pitching change didn't slow things down as Tremblay was greeted by a 2 run RBI by Todd Desaulnier. Dale Caron followed up with another run scoring single and one out later Jay Bohrosn launched a 3 run homer to finish the scoring at 8 in the inning. In B5 the Canadians sent 6 men to the plate but could only score 1 run as **Darcy** Haluzan replaced Iron and limited the scoring. The damage at the top of the inning and the disappointment at the bottom seemed to deflate Moose Jaw and they were not able to score again. The Saskatoon Padres completed the upset, going from winless in the preliminary round directly to the final with the win.
