# Day of Reckoning

# Field narrowed to four for 2006 Championship

Patsy's in Championship final...County and Farm Tavern seek berth – Riversharks chomping for re-match......Friday's matches were typical ISC competition, with pitching important and run production crucial to success.

New York Patsy's received the coveted invite to today's final game with a disciplined match last night, staking Aussie youngster Adam Folkard to an early lead and watching the young righty spin a superb 2-hitter, beating Orillia 4-2.

In other action The Farm Tavern built a 4-1 lead, and used **Dean Holoien** in relief of **Korrey Gareau** to win 4-3 over Saskatoon, SK Aspen Black Sox, who finished 5<sup>th</sup> (same as last year) with a 5-2 W-L record.

Marathon County Materials spotted the Hallman Twins to a 3-0 first inning lead, but countered with their own arsenal — a 3-run dinger from **Jeff Goolagong** to eventually win 4-3. Twins finish 6<sup>th</sup>, down a few notches from last year's 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish.

Other team's final standing include Ballston Lake Heflin Gremlins (7<sup>th</sup> – up from 23rd last year) and Fargo Kegel Black Knights (8<sup>th</sup>, up from 11<sup>th</sup> last year).



# Host Twins so very close -have sweet tourney - finish 6th

The **Host Kitchener Hallman Twins** had a remarkable run of five straight W's in the Losers' bracket to get to the final six in the tournament. The run ended when the Twins faced the defending champion **Marathon, WI County Materials**, who was ripe for the picking. In B-1<sup>st</sup>, Twins opened a 3-0 lead courtesy of **Dale Levy's** blast to the centre field bleachers, plating **Greg Miller** and **Jody Eidt** who had singled.

The early lead inspired Twins' pitcher **Don Scott**, who has notched a couple of remarkable mound performances against County over the past couple of seasons, including a shut-out victory in an area tournament. Scott was focused and held the Marathoners to a single hit through 4 innings. With a 3 run lead, it was tempting to count down the remaining outs. BUT - County Materials didn't break..... they didn't fold – they didn't even bend.

In the 5<sup>th</sup>, the defending champs simply did what was needed - Kiwi Jarrad Martin led off reaching 1st base on an error, Aussie Chris Kiefel doubled and fellow countryman from down under - Jeff Goolagong - delivered with a solid bleacher-clearing 'tater. Very quickly - tie game! Twins maintained their composure but County's gangly pitcher, Andrew Kirkpatrick, realized that he was given renewed incentive. "Cheesey", sensing good fortune in the cards, struck out 5 of the next half-dozen Twins he faced. In the 7th, Marathon's bottom of the order produced with back-toback hits by Zenon Winters and Todd Schultz to put runners on the corners, providing an opening to intentionally walk Donnie Hale to load the bags. With one out, a double play could salvage the inning. However, adversity reared its ugly head - a wild pitch/passed ball combo that eluded Twins catcher Chris Shewfelt, allowed Winters to score. Game.. set.. match. Twins lose 4-3 and are eliminated, finishing 6th with a 6W-2L record.





## Canadian title stays at home

Palermo jumped out to a 1-0 lead only to have Tavistock leapfrog ahead with a two-RBI single by Jamie Rader ... the Athletics tied the game in the fifth as Chris McColl drove in Peter Dobbin ... in T-8. Palermo was unable to score the international tiebreaker runner placed on seconder was in effect ... in B-8, Mark McKay drove in Brad Roth with the winning run, setting off a thunderous celebration on the field and in Tavistock ... Winning pitcher Steve Cook relieved starter Rvan Cummings (T-7) with the score knotted ...The Gord Newman Memorial ISC II Championship Trophy was presented by sons Paul & Tyler to Tavistock manager Steve Kaufman . Earlier, Tavistock ran over the Perkasie, PA Rise 8-2 in the first semi-final ... backto-back home runs by Brad Roth and Kevin Thompson led the way while

McKay was 3-4 with 3 rbi's ... Cummings got the win, going five strong innings with Steve Cook shutting down the Rise over the final two innings ... Palermo knocked off ISC II strikeout king Corey Costello and the Micksburg, ON Twins 6-1, notching three runs in the 4th, including a line drive HR by Keith Rankin and a triple by Brian Prowse ... Gord Scott picked up another complete game win for Palermo ... Costello pushed his tournament strikeout record to 101 with three strikeouts in three innings of work.






