## **Welcome to Fastball Country**

Players, Officials, Fans converge for 60th annual ISC Championship

#### Welcome back, some for the first time....

The facilities are in pristine condition,, the weatherman is cooperating, the volunteers are pumped! Can a simple collective wish for daily sunshine, the shared yearning of the 1,200 plus members of team rosters, the 500+ Host Community volunteers and 100+ officials become reality?

The internet's **Weather Network** predicts near perfect conditions for the competition – plenty of sunshine, with temperatures in the low-mid twenties, ideal conditions for fastball to be played at its peak and champions to be crowned.

Tom Clancy, Chair of the Schneiders 2006 ISC Tournament, and partner Rick Boyd, chair of the ISC II Tournament of Champions exude the modest confidence that is appropriate on behalf of a community that is proud to have succeeded in convincing "y'all come back again". In 2002, the first foray by the ISC into Waterloo Region, resulted in the event being a huge success. Kitchener's host committee raised the bar on so many aspects of the tournament. With a publicly announced #1 priority that the needs of the competitors come first, the playing conditions "on the field and between the lines" for the players was second to none. The off-field events such as the hugely successful Bridge to the Future Skills Clinic was launched, the Hall of Fame breakfast was fast-paced and well-attended, ball-park food boasted favourable-pricing for an expanded menu, featuring the flag-ship eatery - Donna's Diner. The efficiency of the volunteers, who exhibited enthusiasm and community spirit throughout the entire event, was appreciated by the turnstile count that exceeded 40,000 clicks.

#### What about 2006....

What's in store for 2006?

Good news! Quite simply, **more of the same** Plus even more.

The feedback from the 2002 survey stated the obvious about the #2 priority, which was the needs of the fans. Peter Hallman Ball Yard Diamond #1 needed improvement for the fans. The repositioning of the backstop provides space for more prime field-level seating. The new grandstand seating on the expanded pad ensures great sight-lines for those who enjoy the infield action. For the expanded ISC II Tournament of Champions, the return to Budd Park made sense. The 35 competing teams required more diamonds, and the partnership with the City of Cambridge and the provision of the diamonds (recently topped with player-friendly red clay) at Kinsmen Park has added another jewel to the event. The 67 competing teams will play 171 games, and with competitive match-ups in the World Tourney's foray into EGC32 (Every game Counts 32 teams) and the seven balanced ISC II pools, there will be lots of action spread over the next nine days.



# Owen Sound Fastball Star Recognized...

### Brad Underwood among 4 to be inducted into Hall of Fame

**Brad Underwood**, the fire-balling lefty from Owen Sound, will be provided his due recognition on Sunday when he becomes only the third Canadian player to be inducted into the prestigious **International Softball Congress Hall of Fame.** 

Other Canadian current player inductees, both from Ontario, include **Larry Bodashefsky**, outfielder from Oshawa, inducted in 1997 and Waterloo's own pitcher **Dan Yantzi**, inducted in 2002. Other Canadian inductees are **Bob Minshall**, Burlington, ON (Umpire/Administrator in 2000) and

Neil Fennell, Perth, ON (Administrator in 2002). Suffice to say that Undy's credentials are awesome, as he led his 1988 Owen Sound Canadian Tire team to 3<sup>rd</sup> place at the ISC Championships in Decatur, IL (best finish by Canadian team at that time).

Three years later, the Tiremen followed up with a 2nd place finish (losing to host team and Champion Sioux City, IA Penn Corp) in 1991 when Brad was named the top pitcher. Brad was also named the ISC Outstanding Pitcher in 1994, and collected a Championship ring as a member of the Green Bay, WI All Car Roadrunners, defeating the Toronto Gators in the final match.

Brad was nominated by long-time fastball enthusiast and historian Roger May of Brampton, and will be introduced by Jamie Simpson of Owen Sound, assisted by Brad's catcher fro many memorable games, notably the memorable 1991 ISC tourney, Chuck Hendricks of Tillsonburg, ON.

Other inductees at the Hall of Fame Breakfast on Sunday August 13 at 8:00 am (doors open at 7:30 am) at the Delta Hotel at King and Benton in downtown Kitchener include Saginaw, Michigan's Art Gillies, the 81-year-old icon who has done-it-all as a many-faceted supporter of the ISC as administrator, ambassador, commissioner, manager, tourney host, etc.; Greg Sepulveda of Mission Viejo, California, an outstanding infielder who was named All-World twice in the mid-80's; and Ed Klecker, a dominating pitcher from Sunset Beach, California, a 3-time ISC All-World player in the 70's.
