Defending champs prevail in their own marathon on Saturday

County Materials win three on Saturday – Kirkpatrick earns Top Pitcher Award...

Talented players with raw skills, good management and coaching with focus, fortuitous calls..... YES, they had it all - these Marathoners, aptly named in honor of the long race, not the intermittent sprint, who brought their "A" game to the Ball Yard on Final Day Saturday, needing three back—to -back-to-back successive wins. 




