successful growth

Much progress has been made since the inaugural ISC II Tournament of Champions in Budd Park in 2002. The tournament has visited three cities south of the border – **Appleton**, **WI** in 2003; **Fargo**, **ND** in 2004 and last year in **Chippewa Falls**, **WI**. While Ontario has dominated the silverware, excellent teams from the USA are hoping to make their mark at the 5th anniversary tourney.

From twenty teams in 2002, to 7 pools of 5 teams this year, rivalries have been formed and competition will be keen. In fact, half of the top ten seeds are US

based teams. Perkasi Rise has veteran **Mike Smith** to lead the pitching corps and provide stability to the team, while Millington Upto-Date Painting and the Lumberkings of Bakersfield, CA have full intentions of making the final four.

Bob McGowan and **Blair Setford**, ISC Commissioners and local volunteers ISC II Chair **Rick Boyd**, **Ben Blackwell** and **Larry Cox**, among others, have worked long and hard to prepare for this week's event Six days and 93 games loom – with solid planning and organization in place, the good weather forecast, and the enthusiasm of all participants, it should be another outstanding event.



The South Perth Men's Fastball League officially started in 1969 with teams from Harmony, Conroy, St. Pauls, St. Marys, Sebringville, Mitchell, Fullarton and Avonton. Conroy was the inaugural champion. Rostock Royals, St. Marys Lumber Kings and Mitchell Mets all took turns winning back-to-back titles but never were able to three-peat.

In the 1990s, the back-to-back run continued **St. Marys Staffen's Selects** repeated in 1992-93, followed in 1995-1996 by the **Mitchell Mets**, and 1997-1998 by the **Sebringville Sting**.

In 2002, the league approved a tournament format to declare the end of season championship, and winners have been:

2002- Sebringville Sting 2003- K-W Pride 2004 – Sebringville Sting 2005 – Bridgeport Braves In 2006, there are 18 teams participating in the league, separated into four geographical divisions:


<u>Smith Division</u> - Fullarton A's, Mitchell Mets, Monkton Muskrats and Sebringville Sting





BUT NOT FORGOTTEN

Remember when Bruce Casselman, of the Ottawa area, crouched behind the dish to receive bullets fired by Darren Zack in the hey-days of the Toronto Gators. Bruce was selected All-World in 1993 (BA .300) when Gators went 8-1 in Kimberly, WI and won the ISC Title - and again in 1994 (BA .273) when Gators finished 6-2, second behind All-Car in Summerside, PEI.

Remember when Doug Middleton, a quiet tactician on the mound, efficiently and effectively closed the doors on opposing batters. Doug was All-World four times, the most recent here in Kitchener in 2002 (4W-2L, 56Ks, 0.76 ERA) as part of the ISC Champion St. Joseph, MO Frontier Casino Players; in 2002, with St. Joseph Meierhoffer, he was 4-0, 38 Ks and 0.42 ERA and in 1995, with the Topeka Travelers, he was perfect at 5-0, 63 Ks and a 1.50 ERA.

Remember when Terry Challis was a giant killer and especially a Twins killer, with the surprising "pop" in his bat, and speed on the base-paths. Terry was All-World five times, including a great run of three years when he homered twice and collected 5 rbis each year (2000-01-02) and batted above .300 (.545 in 2001); and a M.V.P.award in 1993 (BA .455).

MEMORABLE GAMES From The Past (1969)...

ISC Hall of Famer Ty Stofflet could have sued his team-mates for lack of support (offence) in the 1969 ISC Tourney in Rock Island, IL as his Philadelphia, PA Sal's Lunch team scored a meager seven runs in five games. Stofflet supplied the "D" from the mound, winning 5 games, all by shutouts (one perfect game and a pair of one-hitters), striking out 86 batters in 42 innings (average of more than 2 per inning). One of the best pitching performances in ISC history as Sal's Lunch, Philadelphia, PA won the ISC title.




