Competition gets serious

- few upsets in World Tourney play

Host team suffers surprising loss

Fans, enticed by perfect fastball weather, and optimistic of continuing success for the host Kitchener Hallman Twins, flocked to Peter Hallman Ball Yard on Sunday evening to encourage the Twinkies in their second-round match-up with Team Rainey from Whittier, California.

Both teams sent their aces to the mound and both hurlers provided their mates with stellar performances. However,

in what would be termed an up-set, the family affair Rainey squad played impeccably to take advantage of opportunities and eke out a 2-1 win. **Bricklin Anderson**, 31 of Victoria, BC, not hugely recognized in eastern Canada for his obvious skills, used the opportunity to showcase his wares. Matching up solidly with his battery-mate, he tossed few fat pitches (save the 7th inning offering to **Chris Shewfelt** who deposited it over the fence for the Twins lone). With a variety of pitches, he rang up 10 strikeouts and was well deserving of the victory. Twins' **Todd Martin** scattered eight hits, but "nibbers" resulted in runs. Flame-throwing **Don Scott** in relief, was impressive, garnering four strikeouts in six batters.

The result relegates Twins to the bracket of teams with losses, and they will play Tuesday at 11:00 am against the winner of **CR Portland** and the **Ohsweken Redmen**. A loss relegates the Twins to having only a single life, and they would play again on Tuesday at 7:00 pm - a win will advance them to a Wednesday afternoon 3:00 pm match.

Six teams perfect at 2-0

Joining Team Rainey with perfect 2-0 records are teams who, quite simply, expected to be there. This provides some great match-ups for games scheduled in the undefeated bracket on Tuesday & Wednesday. County Materials have yet to give up a run and will meet Saskatoon Black Sox on Tuesday at 5:00 pm. This could be termed a Black Sox vs Black Sox ecounter, as the County Materials squad features no less than five New Zealand **National Team Black Sox** Kiwis on its roster, not coincidentally the first five hitters in the batting order.

Team Rainey will have their mitts full when they face the **Massapequa, NY Patsys**, a team capable of destroying any pitcher's confidence (Tuesday at 7:00 pm).

The Orillia Quaker Riversharks have provided Manager Denny Bruckert with optimism, their hot bats scoring 11 runs in two games to provide breathing room to a competent pitching staff. The Sharks meet the west coast Vancouver Grey Sox in Wednesday's 7:00 pm prime-time game on PHBY #1.

Four other **teams with 1-0 records** will clash tonight – <mark>Yucapia SoCal Bombers</mark> meet **Denmark Circle Tap** at 5:00 pm and **Elkhart Albaugh** face **Madison the Farm Tavern** at 7:00 pm.

Health Performance (Part I)



Reflections... A Look Back... GONE..... From The Past (1994)...

BUT NOT FORGOTTEN

Remember when Steve Price, of the Ballston Lake Heflin Gremlins, was a twoway threat - a competent pitcher, he could also beat you with his bat, witness his All-World Selection with the Gremlins in 1998, posting a mound record of 2 wins and a loss, with an impressive 39 Ks in 17' innings, while being named to the All-World squad as a designated hitter, exploding for 5 'taters and 15 rbis, and batting a torrid .563

Remember when Marty Kernaghan, originally of Calgary,'s Alberta Brake and Clutch (ABCs) in mid-eighties, and more notably with the great Sioux City teams for the next decade, could steal game with stellar defensive plays at shortstop o a timely hit (named the 198 MVP at Kimberly with Alberta finishing 3rd.) In eleven seasons, Marty's teams finished in the top four at an amazing 9 times. Marty was inducted into the ISC Hall of Fame in 2002 here in Kitchener, and is an eight time All-World player (1984-95).

Remember when Hayden Smith was toeing the mound and mowing the batters down for Denmark Circle Tap. Hayden was an All-World selection in 1996 when he pitched all of the Tap's gams, forging a 6W-2L record, with 51 Ks in 40 innings and an ERA of 1.47.

MEMORABLE GAMES

ISC Hall of Fame Manager Russ Boice felt retribution had occurred when Green Bay's Colin Abbott launched a fly ball past Toronto Gators' outfielder Brian Paton that was the key hit in a 2-run 7th inning rally that gave All-Car the 1994 title 5-4 in Summerside, PEI. Other notables in the 7th ining rally were catcher John Becker's (currently Marathon County Materials manager) one-out single that ignited the rally, and left fielder Shawn Rychick's (currently also with Marathon) triple that tied the game. Darren Zack (currently with Ohsweken Redmen) had started the game on the mound for the Gators, but left the game due to a shoulder injury, and was replaced by Mike Sedore who was later by Brad Baker who was the 7th inning victim of Green bay's heroics.

Winning Pitcher for Green Bay All-Car was Brad Underwood, who was dominant on the mound, and had a typical day I the batter's box, going 2 for 3, and driving in the first three Green Bay runs.


Around the horn...




