ISC Passes Half-Way Point "Sweet Sixteen" remain after tonight

Vancouver-Orillia Match-up

Prime time game should be a thriller

The Sox, led by Infielder **Derek Mayson's** HR/4-rbi performance, earned two-days' rest with a one-touchdown 8-1 decision over fans' sentimental favorite Heflin Gremlins. On Saturday, Sox nipped Ashland MVD 3-2.

The Riversharks were consistent in easily disposing of Copenhagen Denmark Dynamite Friday 5-2, and Moorhead MinnDak Millers 6-0 on Sunday.

Pitching match-ups will be the pre-game scuttlebutt for the fans, with Sox's **Rick Smith** (1-0) and **Nick Underhill** (1-0) well rested, and other Sox pitchers not yet having received any innings. Orillia, also deep in pitching, has had

excellent performances from **Michael White** (1-0) (his ISC record 70th career on Friday) and Frank Cox (1-0) with Rob O'Brien and Andy Jackson both waiting the call. For depth, O-Bee and A. Jay are both excellent sticks and one will likely be on the line-up card in the DH role.

Battle of Wisconsin

ISC Championship Saturday usually involves the Madison WI, Farm Tavern. The highly touted #2 seed will have all it can handle this afternoon at 5:00 pm with its cross-state rival Denmark, WI Circle Tap (Seeded #10). Both teams have not been seriously tested in their opening pair of matches, and today's game is pivotal to success. Tradition, built-in rivalries, pride and Wisconsin bragging rights all play a factor in this game. In the mid-west, teams know how to play the game and strategy for the war and not the battle will be obvious. The pitching matchup could feature a pair of Canadians, hard-throwing hurlers from BC-The Farm's Korry Gareau & Collin McKenzie for The Tap. Winners today advance to the guarter-finals in Thursday's primetime doubleheader and enjoy the luxury of rest for pitching arms and time for recovery for injuries. Losers today will have to win six (6) in a row for the 2006 title, while winners have half that work-load with but a single game for each of the next 3 days... what a tremendous incentive!







ISC NAMES INDUCTEES FOR 2007 Kitchener's Larry Lynch joins Dan Yantzi

The International Softball Congress named five softball veterans, including Kitchener's own Larry Lynch, a sports aficionado if there ever was one, for 2007 induction in the ISC Hall of Fame.

Lynch joins Waterloo's **Dan Yantzi**, who was inducted in 2002, and will be recognized for his 32 years of participation in softball, including 19 years as a competitor in ISC leagues, and 16 appearances as a team Manager in the World Tournament, including eight "top-ten" finishes.

Other inductees include players **Peter Meredith**, 7 time all-world pitcher primarily with the Salt Lake City Larry Miller Toyota Teams and Catcher **Tim Wahl**, 8 time All-World member with teams in Bellevue WA; Sioux City, IA; Madison, WI; & Decatur, IL Also inducted from Ontario is **Lloyd Simpson** of Owen Sound. Simpson is generally regarded as the visionary who introduced ISC brand softball to Ontario in the seventies, and he will be recognized in the "Builder" category".


The fifth inductee is **Bob Tomlinson** of Minnesota, for hi years of service as a commissioner and fastball enthusiast who promoted the sport with his newspaper, the Fast pitch Chronicle.

The Induction Ceremony will be held Sunday August 12,2007 right here in Kitchener as the community hosts the ISC tourney for a 2^{nd} successive year.

A bit of this and a bit of that....

Are You Ready For a Lube Job?

Do your joints ache or get stiff or swell after activity? It's possible you may be experiencing the first signs of osteoarthritis.

This type of arthritis is more commonly referred to as the "wear and tear" type of arthritis. The most common factors that may predict whether someone may develop OA are genetic and past injury. There are many things that can be done to improve symptoms and keep people going. These include Physio or Athletic Therapy for strengthening, diet and exercise for weight management, bracing and orthotics for alignment and support, and various medications includina cortisone injections.

Another type of injection is called viscosupplementation and actually isn't classified as a drug. In joints that are wearing out, the joint fluid is thinner. Viscosupplementation is essentially the thick part of normal fluid which is injected back into the joints. It could be thought of as a "lube job". Many people have found that these injections help them

stay active and lessen or take away aching and swelling. If you have any of these symptoms, it is worth talking with your physician to determine if you have OA, and which treatments you could benefit from. No one likes to be slowed down!

Remember when **Boomer Brush** strutted to the plate late in a game as a pinch hitter, or in his regular DH spot in the line-up. If the game was "on-theline", Boomer's stick is what turned a game around, igniting rallies and change the pace of the match. In 1997, with the place Tampa Bay Smokers, he 4th batted a torrid .533 with 6 rbis to claim a spot in the All-World outfield. In 1998, Smokers claimed the the ISC Championship, and Boomer was a catalyst, with 2 homers, 7 rbis and a memorable .500 batting average. Six vears later, following the Smokers to Canada where they became the Calgary Diamonds, Boomer was named an All-World DH (3 homes, 5 rbis, BA .316. for a 3rd time as Diamonds finished in 3rd

MEMORABLE GAMES From The Past (1996)

In 1996, in beautiful Sunset Park in Kimberly, WI, there was a "shot" and while it wasn't the shot "heard round the world", it was a shot that stunned the huge crowd at the ISC title game. Green Bay All-Car Roadrunners scored twice in the first to provide starting lefty Mike Piechnik with an early cushion over the Tampa Bay Smokers. In the 3rd. Jason Hanson stroked a homer off Piechnik, who was replaced by Michael White in the 5th with the game tied 2 apiece. In the bottom of the 7th, with one man aboard, White had a favorable 0-2 count on Hanson, when White pulled a muscle. He was replaced by Michael Gaiger, a fireballer who had limited action and threw lightning (8Ks in the 5 innings). Fans were barely comfortable back in their seats following a stretch while Gaiger tossed his obligatory 5 warmup pitches, when Gaiger "rocked and fired" and Hanson uncoiled. The fly to deep left field was tracked by All-Car outfielder Shawn Rychcik, who even climbed the outfield fence to corral the ball, but it was well over the fence. An automatic, walk-off home run and the Smokers were 1996 champions.


