## New offensive bullies emerge...Patsy's Paste County Materials

The largest crowd of the week enjoyed a day of good ol' fastball at Peter Hallman Ball Yard. Of the ten games scheduled for "getaway day" (for teams eliminated from the event) seven went down to the last batter with the score differential being two runs or less.
The day started with a 9 -inning roller-coaster of emotions as Fargo, ND Kegel Black Knights defeated Green Bay, WI Townline 4-3 on a bases-loaded 2-out and 2 strike unt hit by Tim Macumber. And the day got better as the sun rose, peaked and set on the 'Yard - with perfect weather conditions accenting the pristine conditions on the fields.

Attendance by knowledgeable softball fans was on the upswing for the 1:00 pm match-up between host Kitchener Hallman Twins and the Vancouver Grey Sox. The host Twins added another " $W$ " to their momentum building march to the weekend, as fireballer Don Scott came oh-so-close to a no-hitter. Scott was staked to an early lead, and was throwing with confidence, completing six innings of one-hit pitching. Todd Martin in relief in the $7^{\text {th }}$, got two quick outs before dishing up a home run to keep fans on the edge of their seats before retiring the side. The Twins 2-1 win eliminated the $6^{\text {th }}$ seeded Sox.

Attendance increased for the Championship round doubleheader, and there was a buzz in the air as four undefeated teams squared off in the double-header that relegated two teams to the Losers' Bracket.
In the 7:00 pm game, fan sentiment was behind the Patsy's of New York, NY, who brought their behometh line-up to the Yard, to do what few have done in the past few years - beat the \#1 seeded defending champion Marathon, WI County Materials. Gerald Muizelaar, dominant pitcher since the turn of the century, toed the rubber for the Patsy's, and Argentina's Lucas Mata was on the mound for County. The pitching match-up was superb and the game was scoreless through 4 innings, In the 5h, Muizelaar
enjoying a 1-2-3 outing. In B-5, crafting a one-hit performance of his own, Mata was rudely greeted by Patsy catcher Frank DeGroat who hit a line drive homer over the centre field bleachers. Next batter Daniel Milne punctuated the statement with his own towering moon-shot to left centre and the Patsys had all they needed with a 2-0 lead. Mata gave way to Andrew Kirkpatrick who struck out the side. In the $6{ }^{\text {th }}$, Patsy's doubled their output, confirming the statement that "everything starts with two out" as a walk to Brad Rona, two wild pitches/passed balls, an error and Degroat's $2^{\text {nd }}$ hit of the game, doubled the score to $4-0$. Fans, conscious of County's reputation of being the big bullies on the block, were appreciative of the new "Kids on the Block" from Manhatten, who did some spanking of their own. ## Quaker Riversharks devour Farmers

Earlier, Orillia Quaker Riversharks, the team assembled to build a winner, did just that as pitcher Frank Cox of Owen Sound effectively scattered 5 hits in leading the Sharks to a 3-1 win over the \#2 seeded Farm Tavern of Madison, WI.
The Farm took a 1-0 lead in B-4 on a Rob Gray single, eventually making his way to $3^{\text {rd }}$ Base to score on a Todd Budke sacrifice fly.

In T-5, Sharks got Cox all he needed, as Pat MacKintosh led off with a home run, and Pat Graham and Stacey Mclean singled, with Sharks taking advantage of some loose Farm-yard defensive chores to score three in the inning.

Graham and Mclean, along with Townsend native Ian Fehrman each had two hits for the Sharks, while Gray and Keith MacIntosh split four of the Farm's total five hits.

The win sets the stage for a classic Friday night match-up with "big-time city" Patsy's testing the resolve of Orillia's small-town roster. Both teams realize that the win Friday night is strategic, with the victor advancing to the Championship final on Saturday at 4:00 pm. Tonight's loser will have to win a semi-final match at 2:00 pm Saturday prior to the championship game.

Look for Patsy's young Aussie sensation Adam Folkard to toe the rubber for New York, while Sharks could counter with Michael White (all-time ISC career wins leader), or the versatile and effective Rob O'Brien, himself no stranger to closing weekend mound performances.

Jeremy Tracy had a monster home run and picked up the win for TNT over Harriston, ON Mercurys ... Tim Dubois has the gamewinning RBI in the 9th as Kitchener knocked out the fan-favourite Bakersfield, CA California Lumberkings ... Brad Pender keys a Micksburg rally from down four to rebound against Alvinston, ON Indians to win 5-4 ... Highlight of the day: Trailing 5-0 into the sixth, Palermo rallies for $8(!)$ runs against the defending champion Elmira, ON Cubs ... Gord Scott re-enters the game after reliever Chad Reed pinched a nerve in his shoulder and strikes out the final batter with the bases loaded to preserve a 8-5 win.
