Many Favourites Advance to 2-0

"By Golly" - Twins lose Heart-breaker in extra inning.....

SoCal, Circle Tap, Farm, Orillia, Broken Bow and upstart Albaugh win second matches... As predicted, the favorites won second round match-ups with the exception of the hometown Kitchener Hallman Twins who lost a heart-breaker to unheralded Elkhart, IA Albaugh Inc. The mid-west boys, a squad unfamiliar to fans in the east, earned their second shutout victory of the early going on the arm and bat of hardworking southpaw Karl Gollan. The resident of Bluegrass, IA effectively mixed off-speed pitches, low in the strike zone to keep the Twins at bay through seven regulation innings. Lady Luck appeared to avoid the Twins and support Gollan, as a couple of line drives to the outfield and hot shots on the infield Mar-Co clay drew a bead directly to Albaugh's wellpositioned fielders. Behind the scenes at the ISC....Game Controllers

Roy Stout has been the World Tournament Games Controller for many years. He's retired from the US Navy, is an active umpire, and lives in Lake Hughes, California. Lake Hughes, Roy tells me, is on the flight path for the returning Challenger space craft. When the TV reports that the flight is landing at Edwards Air Force Base, he can look out his door and see it going overhead. Roy uses his experience and contacts in the ISC world to keep the pregame negotiations calm and orderly, as only a retired navy salt can. Watching Roy work his magic with competing team managers last year in Kitchener last year was a joy to behold. All these top flight ISC teams hold Roy in high regard and respect his pre-game leadership

Joining Roy this year and assisting him as games controllers are three volunteers who held identical roles in 2006.

Bob McKillop is a former University of Waterloo hockey and football coach, and currently administers the huge Kitchener Minor Hockey Association. Bob was coach of the Waterloo Warriors hockey team that won the Canadian University hockey championship in 1972, and is a member of the U of W Athletic Hall of Fame along with his team.

John MacTavish is one of the most well-known fastball fans in Ontario. He attends most of the Major tournaments, here in Ontario from Monkton to Orillia, to Perth and has been behind the screen in Michigan, Missouri, North Dakota and Wisconsin, and even attended the ISF world championships in New Zealand. With that

experience and his knowledge of the game, his friendship with the mangers and players in the ISC, and the respect that he has gained in the fast-pitch community makes John a great Game Controller.

Glenn Moeser is a local fastball legend. There is not a fastball park in Ontario that Glenn has not been in. He is one of the founders of the Waterloo CHYM'rs, the forerunner of the current Kitchener Hallman Twins. Glenn has managed some great ball players, knows the rest of them, and has the experience to help Roy and the rest of the Games Control crew keep the games running on time, and keeping the fans and players up to date on the flow of the tournament. A wild pitch quickly moved the runners up 60 feet. Chris Shewfelt was intentionally walked to load the bases with one out. Gollan dug deep to strike out Ron White, providing DP Dave Bailey with the opportunity to become the hometown hero for the evening. Bailey and Gollan tangled – with a 2-2 count Bailey fouled of four pitches before delivering what appeared to be the knock-out punch with a fly deep to left field. However, it was caught just 6 feet short of the fence. Tied at 0-0, it appeared that a lengthy extra-inning affair was ahead. In T-8, Albaugh's goto-guv. the effervescent Gollan delivered the heart-breaker, pounding a Todd Martin pitch "bye-bye" over the right-field fence. It was deja-vu for Gollan who hit a similar game-winning HR on Friday to defeat St. Thomas). In B-8, reliever Terry Luster of Bunceton, MO was flawless as he struck out three Twins for the save - Final Score Albaugh 1 Twins 0.
