The playoff picture has become a little bit clearer, However, there are 6 of 9 teams still alive for the top four spots (and an extra playoff life) and no one has been eliminated from that 8th and final playoff spot.

Sitting at 3 wins and hoping for at least one more is Saskatoon G-Force and Carnduff Southeast Steelers. Both teams will have it tough tomorrow with G-Force playing Kars and Calahoo and Carnduff facing Kars and Smitty's. Those games could allow the 2 wins and 2 losses teams Kars and North Delta Sunfire into the top four. The Sunfire may have it easier playing Synergy and NFL Impact. The other 2 win teams Saskatoon Synergy will had to fight to make into the top 4 as they need 2 wins and are playing North Delta and Calahoo.

According to the rules the final playoff spot could produce tiebreakers. as one-win Lady Diamondbacks will play NFL tomorrow and an Impact win could produce a tiebreaker if other games fall in a certain way. One-win Smitty's could also get forced into a tie breaker if they lose their first game tomorrow to the Lady Diamondbacks and later to Carnduff. It is looking like the big games for the last playoff spots are the lady Diamondbacks Newfoundland tilt as well as the Lady Diamondback Smitty's game

- 1. Leading off from the North Delta Sunfire, #23 Sara Riske. In her game vs Kars, she hit 2 triples and a double in 5 appearances, bringing her tournament average up to .545. She also scored 3 runs and had 3 RBI. In her second game of the day she became the first player in this championship to put one over the fence, driving one into the net protecting the scoreboard.
- 2. In the second spot is #16 for the North Delta Sunfire Leah Riske. In her game vs. Kars she went 2 for 4 with 4 RBI. Leah and Sara Riske accounted for 7 of the 11 team's RBI in the game
- 3. In the third spot in the lineup, from DC Kars Aces, outfielder #21 **Tessa Thomas.** In the game vs BC, she hit 2 triples and a single in 4 appearances. That brought her tournament average up to .645.
- 4. In the clean up spot we have from the Saskatoon Co-op G Force designated player #14 Jordan Kulbida. In her game vs SK3 She hit 2

- 7. In the seventh spot from Calahoo Erins is #34, pitcher, **Courtney** Auger. In her 5 inning win against Newfoundland she faced 16 batters, one over the minimum, allowing only a walk.
- 8. The eighth spot in the lineup will be taken by Saskatoon Lady diamondbacks outfielder #23 Kim Vibert. She went 4 for 5 against DC to move her championship batting average to .615. she also recorded 2 RBI and scored a run.
- 9. The finals spot on the All-Star lineup is filled by the first baseman from Calahoo Erins, #1 Camille Czarnecki for the second straight day. Camille went 3 for 4 vs. the Steelers She finished her day with a championship leading batting average of .816I
